In 2024, we celebrated our **21st year of ministry.** Our volunteers and staff hosted a variety of classes and events at **24 adult and juvenile correctional facilities** and **6 churches** across Georgia, Tennessee, and Mississippi.



We couldn't have said it better! Our volunteers, chaplains, and staff helped to break generational cycles of crime and incarceration by providing purposeful programming

to the prison community so that incarcerated people return to their families and communities as transformed individuals.

Our programs include: guitar, art, horticulture, financial literacy, Little Readers, mentoring, parenting, seminary education, leadership, beekeeping, cooking, quilting, choir, Pickleball, aquaponics, book club, and we provided **372 hours of free** trauma counseling sessions!

Spring Highlight

HeartBound hosted its **eleventh** annual Returning Hearts Celebration at Walker State Prison and our **first-ever** RHC at Burruss Correctional Training Center. **56 men, 90 children and families, and over 130 volunteers participated**.

Autumn Highlight


We partnered with **Trinity Anglican Church** to bring the **Alpha Program** to residents at the Atlanta Transitional
Center. Alpha helps create a space for honest conversation around some of life's biggest questions while providing the chance to encounter Jesus.

Summer Highlight

HeartBound introduced two new programs inside prisons - **Pickleball**, and in conjunction with the GA Secretary of State's Office, the **Money Talks Financial Literacy Program**. We also hosted our first-ever Hard Time Honey pop-up shop.

Winter Highlight

For the first-time ever, one of our formerly incarcerated juvenile students attended Songs in the Night! **Thanks to our incredible donors we raised over \$123,000** to support Christ-centered programming.

Our programming, largely due to your financial support, has expanded like never before. Every week, our staff and volunteers led 36 different classes inside prisons. Our team interacted with 500-700 inmates on any given week, or 1% of the entire prison population in Georgia. That's pretty remarkable considering that our budget is 3,200 times smaller than the budget of the entire Georgia Department of Corrections.
